Three pillars


Animal welfare and the 3Rs

- Animal welfare as long as is needed
- Replace, Reduce, Refine, (3Rs)
- Licensing system (CCD), Advice (NCad)
- Actions on e.g. systematic reviews & preregistration of animal studies



Transition towards animal-free innovations (TPI)

- Policy: TPI partner programme & office
- Focus on: Development, validation, acceptance & implementation of NAMs
- Networking, partnering, dialogue and communication
- International transition



- Within the context of European laws and regulations
- Without hampering scientific progress and safety
- Phase-out mainly a European approach!

TPI in 6 objectives LVVN (TPI)

More national development & application of NAMs (e.g. Growth Fund CPBT, M€124,5, NWA call, MKMD funding program) Catalyse EU transition to animal-free innovation (e.g. EU strategy like proposal for the European Research Area agenda) More dissemination, dialogue & network (e.g. international conference, local TPI networks, Young TPI) More stimulation of NAM research infrastructure (e.g. 6_0 VitalTissue) More promotion on Open Science in support of NAMs & 3Rs (e.g. Systematic reviews, preclinicaltrialregister) More exploration on ways to phase-out specific animal tests (needs EU approach, active contribution to EC roadmap phasing out animal stusies for chemicals)
